Testimony

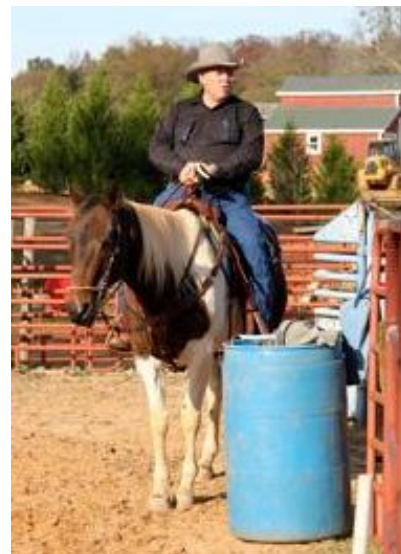

During his demonstration, the Lord worked on Nick's heart to the point that, just as he was explaining the rebelliousness of the horse, looking to go his own way and running around in mindless circles rather than submitting to the master, Nick realized that that was what he had been doing with the Lord. He wrote: "After many years of running in that circle and not wholly trusting in the Lord, I was now ready to follow Him." Nick rededicated his life and is now zealously serving the Lord and working diligently at his college classes.



He just came back from Thanksgiving break where he was able to present our ministry in his grandmother's church. Gethsemane Baptist Church, Greenville

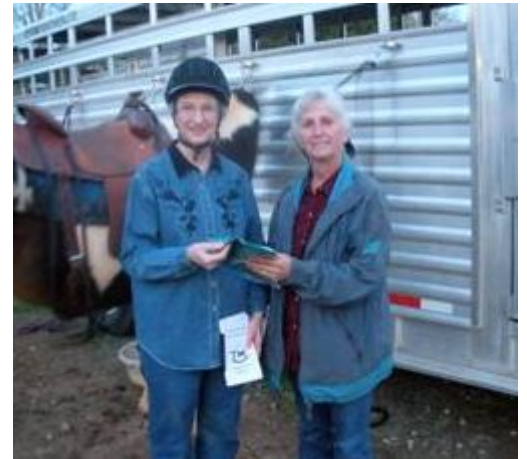

Colton is twelve and has gone from riding for a half an hour to an hour each Saturday. One can imagine what a huge milestone that has been for his parents! Dupont Trail Ride Redirected

Our day after Thanksgiving trail ride was another testimony of how the Lord works. We had planned as usual to go to North Carolina to Dupont State Forest. Thanksgiving day we took one of the extension wranglers out to dinner and then to the ranch for a short trail ride, afterwards we loaded horses to bring back to our place in Travelers Rest for the next day. We got home just at dark, and I noticed that one of the horses had jerked a shoe off. I called our good friend and farrier Truman to see if he could help us out. He had thought about coming on our trail ride earlier. He told us that the weather forecast said snow in the mountains and 20 mph winds. He advised not to go because of the trees falling in the wind. He agreed to take us



on another trail ride north of Clemson in lower elevation. We still braced ourselves as it was going to be cold and windy even there. We had been praying for the weather, but, frankly, as I wrote to the riders the day before, I thought the Lord just wanted us to "cowboy up" and endure. I did not have much faith.

As it turned out we had a beautiful sunny day and everyone really enjoyed the ride. Many decided it was their favorite. JB said it was the most peaceful day he has experienced, because of his post-traumatic distress syndrome condition, since Viet Nam. He attributes it to, first of all, the Lord, and then riding and experiencing the creation that the Lord has provided through horses and the trail ride. Praise our Lord for His faithfulness to us all!
