June Horsemanship Camps

Our camp numbers were down this year, but the ministry opportunities abounded. We did have campers from as far away as Montana, Indiana, and Alabama. We had an increase in the number of people wanting lessons, so we did double duty and fit them around our camp schedule. It worked out well, so that when the campers were in the chapel or class, we did lessons. You can see from the pictures the tremendous

One of the camp days, we scheduled a girls' scout troop to join the campers as Caleb gave a demonstration on trimming a horse's hoof, Curt and I did the Nature of the Horse and Trust demonstration giving the gospel, and then we took the scouts out on a trail ride while the campers went to chapel. We ended by answering questions and giving out our tract to about fifteen.



We had a special group of about 50 from the Southside Christian Day Camp group. We again did a special Nature of the Horse demonstration with Willow, and Curt giving a gospel presentation and demonstration about cowboy gear, relating it to our armour from Ephesians 6. Many of the students had never seen a horse up close. They were able to pet and then ask questions about each horse. They left with our fliers and tracts in hand.


Trip to Indiana

Snyder's Birthday Party


We had quite a group at the Snyder's grandson's birthday party. We are thankful for all that the Snyders at the Double S Ranch do for the ministry!

- Items to be sold to help supplement our income.

- Good horse hay both for the Double S Ranch and for our place in Travelers Rest.
- Money to shoe our horses, especially for the trail rides. The Lord has supplied through the summer.
- Sponsor for horse show ribbons and t-shirts. We have someone who will be doing signs and banners for us.
- Money for horse medications
- Equipment to be able to float the horses' teeth.
- Lime, fertilizer, and grass seed for our pasture.
- Paint for the storage barn
- Home site-yard work; burn pile; pasture
- Canister vacuum for wood floors Curt ordered a part for our vacuum and replaced it, but then still had to take it to the shop because it did not work. To our surprise it only cost \$20 to get it back running! What a blessing not to have to use the shop vac anymore!
- Steering box fixed on our diesel pickup, We have someone who has volunteered to fix it but we need the money for the parts, insurance, and tags
- Donated dump truck plates and insurance
- Fertilizer and seed spreader (3-point hitch)
- Drag harrow
- Time and co-laborers to do the work that needs to be done. We've had some great help this summer. Praying for a good crew of college extension people for the school year.
