




Testimony

We have been praying that Caleb, our ranch summer intern, would be able to find a place to live for the summer. He has decided to stay and help with the ranch, being a camp counselor, and helping with the many jobs needing to be done. We have had an answer to prayer, as one of our advisory board members and his wife, who are missionaries, have given him their garage apartment to use. He just needs to keep the yard work done while they are away. What a blessing! Please pray that the Lord will supply Caleb's financial needs. He is staying here by faith.

Praise the Lord!

We have been waiting on promised funds to pay our lawyer fees that we incurred getting our tax exemption. The funds have not yet come in; however, we paid the last payment from our personal funds, so we have that behind us.

Praise the Lord for the good horses that the Lord has provided. When I looked at the pictures from our last show, and saw all the umbrellas (a horse's huge fear issue), I was so thankful! For most horses this would be a disaster!







Continuing Needs

We have had several ask us about our needs. We have been hesitant to share, as we are living by faith and asking the Lord to supply, but here are a few of the things you could be praying about:

- Good horse hay both for the Double S Ranch and for our place in Travelers Rest. It costs about \$150 per horse per month for hay and grain.
- Money to shoe our horses, especially for the trail rides. It costs \$75 per horse every 6-8 weeks. We have had to drop back to just trimming them, but that means not able to use them for our off-site trail rides, which helps bring in needed revenue and are great opportunities to witness. We would welcome the funds to be able to purchase trail boots that would help in the long run, but they cost \$260 per horse.
- Someone who could work on some small engine equipment to get them running, so we can put them up for sale, and rototill our garden. Answered almost immediately after the last prayer letter. We now have our rototiller back and have put in our vegetable garden. Praise the Lord!
- Sponsor for horse show ribbons and camp t-shirts
- Money for antibiotics. We try to do our own vet work as much as possible. But anyone who has
 horses knows there is always something. We administer our own medications, but need the money
 to buy the meds. Had someone donate \$100 for one of our horses to have her teeth floated,
 which was an urgent need.
- We would like to buy the equipment to be able to float the horses teeth. They need that done once a year. It costs \$120 per horse to go to the vet. Needless to say, we have some that are in need, but we have only been able to do the most needy ones. If we had the money to buy the equipment that would greatly reduce our cost and be able to do all the horses on a regular basis.
- Lime, fertilizer, and grass seed for our pasture

- More students and wranglers to sign up for summer camps
- Paint for the storage barn
- Canister vacuum for wood floors
- Steering box fixed on our diesel pickup, We have someone
 who has volunteered to fix it but we need the money for the
 parts, insurance, and tags
- Fertilizer and seed spreader (3-point hitch)
- Drag harrow
- We had a family donate their older dump truck (in great condition) to us. We can now haul manure from the barn to spread on our pastures. We are sure that the Lord has more uses for it in the future. We were also given bricks. We will use the old bricks that were in the cemetery to line our ditch to prevent erosion and the truck will definitely help with that.



Praise the Lord for His provision recently to meet our everyday needs. It is very humbling, but exciting to see how God supplies from sources unexpected. It is a great blessing when people support us. It helps us to be encouraged to continue on. Thanks to you the work will get done.
